

And, apparently, the tradition for the Riverfront Park show was to meet at Waffles Plus on Monroe St. for a pre-show hearty breakfast, before making our way, in our own Mustang mini parade, to our designated area on Spokane Falls Blvd.

The restaurant was barely adequate to hold the number of Mustangers that showed up during my early years with the club. We used almost every table, leaving little space for the ordinary citizen who might want to enjoy an egg and a waffle early on a Saturday morning. In addition the parking lot and the street parking was occupied by Mustangs in all directions, which created a impromptu car show for neighbors and passers-by.

The waitstaff and cooks were very friendly and seemed to enjoy having their establishment full of loud laughter and tales of cars lost and gained. I remember being amazed that we were all actually served fairly quickly, and they kept the coffee flowing the whole time. The club members generously tipped the staff on our way out, a trait that I find commendable and typical with this club.

We lined up on Spokane Falls Blvd with military-like precision, with one club member directing and indicating the perfect angle at which to set the cars for best effect. I found myself woefully under-equipped for the show. I didn't realized that required supplies included multiple folding chairs with cup holders, 16 kinds of detailing sprays, treatments, cloths, and rubs. Snacks, drinks, coolers, blankets, bug spray were also absent from my prep list. I was not ready for all the material that fell from the trees (The car show veterans knew better and parked in the open areas) so I spent the day dusting off the buds, flowers, and twigs that constantly dropped on my car.






