A little bit of the history of our Mustang. It was purchased as a project about 35 years ago by my uncle, Gordon Sontowski in Vancouver BC Canada. The original color was light green with a fair bit of rust. I was a mechanic at the time. I also had a project car at the time; a 1968 Pontiac Firebird. Gordon was an Iron worker so he was very skilled with welding and metal repair. Gordon was



busy fixing all the rust which included the windshield cowl area, floors, inner fender aprons and torque boxes. While he was busy doing this in his home shop I was rebuilding the 289 CI engine and C4 transmission in my shop at home. The car was coming along quite nicely I may say. I was then at Gordons shop rebuilding the brakes and front suspension.

After all the body and mechanical work was completed Gordon took the car to a local body shop for a Forest Green

paint job. When he got the car home it looked stunning, our work was still not done though, as the bumpers, badges, grill and interior still needed to be finished.

Finally the car was finished, as was my '68 Firebird. We enjoyed going to the local A&W local car show once a week to show off our cars. In 2005 Gordon had a major stroke and passed away a few months later. His daughter inherited the Beautiful 67 GTA Mustang.

I had moved to Spokane in 2002 and had a 1967 Mustang coupe that I brought with me along with my Firebird. I joined the IEMC in February 2003. I do enjoy the great camaraderie of the IEMC as I had no family in Spokane. In September 2004 I married Pattiya. (Cont. next page)



MEMBERS HONORED TO REPRESENT IEMC AT FAIR ON SEPTEMBER LITH


