

In the late 70's my father and one of his friends wanted to be cool and have Mustangs, so they went down to Eller Motors in Spokane and found two used Mustangs. One was a 1967 fastback and the other a 1967 coupe. My dad decided to go with the fastback because he felt it would hold its value better over time, so a fastback became our Family Truckster (see above photo 1967 fastback purchased in 1970).

Many memories were created around this car, like my parents hauling us kids to sporting events, learning how to drive, and even the memory of getting my first ticket while cruising Riverside with my best friend in the 80's. 

was very grateful and excited, but the car needed a LOT of work just to get it running (see gifted car 2023 picture). Luckily, my husband and one of his friends have a little bit of mechanical knowhow which made me feel a little better when looking at the flat tires and miscellaneous car parts laying around. The three of us, (mainly his friend) worked on it

for about a year with others, like my husbands sons, pitching in to get the car running and driving for the first time (see pictures). The big smile and arm pump is from the first time it fired up.

At this point we have completed the following work:

- Remove and replace floor pans
- Repair hood cowl rust areas
- Replace heater/heater Core
- Replace brake lines/brakes/drums
- Replace fuel tank, fuel lines, fuel pump and sending unit
- Replace shocks
- New Tires
- Repair and paint rally wheels
- Misc. electrical
- Rebuild carburetor
- Have Mustang Andy rebuild carburetor again

Our next steps are to redo the interior and then eventually body work and maybe paint, but we don't have the skills or time right now. We will find a way and since I am now a member of the IEMC Mustangs club I am hoping for some advice at upcoming events from those that have already walked in my shoes.
