

After selling the Mach 1 428CJ which we owned since 1996 I wanted another classic car to enjoy. Both the Mustangs we had before were completely stock. This time I wanted a car that was a classic but had modern amenities so I had a much more comfortable ride.

In high school I had a few cars but my favorite was a 1972 Mercury Comet GT. The car was a 302V8, automatic, PS, and PB. The car was a lot of fun and quick with the lower weight of the car. This was the Mercury version of the Maverick Grabber. The Ford Maverick was the second best rollout only to the Mustang by Ford.



I began looking online for a car similar to the car I had in high school. I wanted a rust free 2-door car that was complete. A few months later I found a 1977 Mercury Comet 2-door with 78k miles in Asheville NC. I got in touch with the buyer and we spoke on the phone a number of times. He was the third owner of the car.

bumpers to the 70 to 72 style, and added new tires and wheels. Third owner didn't do much to the car other than drive it.

After a number of calls I set a date to meet and flew to Asheville to look over and purchase the car. He met me and picked me up in the Comet. We went to his house and placed the car on the rack for examination. The car has virtually no rust. Afterwards I drove the car and we went to his bank, signed paperwork and paid for the car. I hit

the highway with no plates and ashtray delete so I couldn't use my GPS.



First night, I made it to Jackson TN. The next morning I was on the road with everything going well until just east of Dallas. I hit a rain storm which shorted out my electric fans. I made it off the exit to a gas station where a young man came over to look at the car. I explained to him what had happened and he offered to correct the wiring issue. He fixed the car and I paid him, which he reluctantly accepted.

So far the following has been done to the car:

Engine removed, checked over, and painted; Added 8 stack Speedmaster billet fuel injection and Holley Sniper self tuning ECU; Polished billet serpentine; new chrome starter and alternator; Polished billet PS Pump; Car was retired with Painless Wiring; Modern Air w/ polished billet air conditioning; Rebuilt front end w/ Total Control Products and coil over shocks; New four link rear end with Strange coil overs

This fall the car will go in for bodywork and new paint. She will be Pearl Candy Teal.

I've purchased an original hood scoop for a Comet GT which I will add. The hood from the scoop and the rear end will be candy silver.

The interior will have bucket seats and will be redoing the whole interior in grey leather. I hope to have the car completed by late spring 2026


